HAPPY EASTER

Spring has arrived in the Northwoods. March has been especially good to us with warm weather and the melting of the snow. There are only a few patches of ice being protected under the shade and insulated by old road dirt and leaves. Those remnants should also be gone within a week or so!

All we need now is some good April showers to clean the winter grime and raise the level of the lake. Moon Lake Status:

March 2010 Weather and Moon Lake Water Conditions by Dale Sharpee

The Marquette, Michigan National Weather Service office has reported that March 2010 will be the warmest, driest, and least snowy March since that office began keeping records in 1961.

Although Moon Lake is not in proximity to that Weather Service office, it appears that the conditions recorded at Marquette have parallels with what has been experienced during March 2010 at Moon Lake. Moon Lake was ice free as of **March 31st**. This is 3 weeks earlier than the time, April 22nd, that Moon Lake was ice free in 2009. Bob Turnquist and I took a reading of the water level on March 30th. We had to dig a trench from the current edge of the lake to get water to flow to the gauge! The reading was 1.16 feet. At ice over on November 22nd the reading was 1.38 feet. So, Moon Lake is now .22 of a foot (approximately 2 5/8th of an inch) lower than last fall.

Here is summary of the water level recorded at the time Moon Lake was ice free since 2005:

The lake level at the time the lake was ice free is now 3.12 feet below the level recorded in 2005.

2010 Cooperative Lakes Monitoring Program by Dale Sharpee

Wilderness Lakes Trails:

As you may be aware, Watersmeet Township recently received a grant award from the Michigan Natural Resources Trust Fund in the amount of \$230,000 to complete the enhancement of the Central Section o the Agonikak National Recreation Trail (Military Road to Allen Lake Road). The project tied for the highest score in the State out of 95 development grant applications. The Watersmeet town board has given approval for the Grant Staff to apply for another grant this year to enhance the Northern Section of the trail and link up to the Watersmeet School and Town Park where the old US 2 Bike route begins (please note the attachment within this email). The grant request for this section will be for the maximum allowed, \$500,000.
